



## LEGISLATION TRACKING AND OUTCOMES FROM OCTOBER 1, 2014 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2015

This chart reflects the activities of the first year of the legislative session from Oct. 1, 2014 through Sept. 30, 2015. During this session the City took position on 24 legislative bills. The City supported 16 bills and opposed eight bills. These bills pertained to local control, fiscal impacts and the environment. The City was actively involved in regional efforts that include:

- Support for increased funding for transportation and improving California’s streets and roads.
- Support for “Fix our Roads” Coalition, a broad coalition of cities, counties, labor, business and transportation advocates formed to meet the Governor’s call to address California’s chronic transportation infrastructure funding shortfall.
- Support for the Surface Transportation Reauthorization bill. Reauthorize funding for transportation projects and significantly increase transit, highway and safety program commitments to cities and their regions, and provide six years of funding certainty in the MAP-21 surface transportation reauthorization.

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## LEGISLATION SESSION OUTCOME CHARTS

A legislative session consists of two years with two one-year cycles. These charts reflect the first one-year cycle from Oct. 1, 2014 through Sept. 30, 2015.

In this legislative session, the City submitted a total of 24 position letters, of which the City supported 16 bills and opposed eight bills. City Departments take position on legislation that affects local control, financial impacts and effect on public safety. The majority of the bills during this legislative session pertained to housing, community and economic development, public safety and environmental quality.

In the upcoming second-year cycle, it is anticipated that the City will continue to be diligent in addressing legislation pertaining to medical marijuana, use of drones, potential closure of the Los Angeles Air Force Base, funding for SoCal ROC, transportation infrastructure and much more.







### Vote Concurrence with the City's Position








