15. HEARINGS:15a. MOBIL OIL CORPORATION PIPELINE FRANCHISE:

Mayor Armstrong announced that this was the time and place for the continued public hearing in the matter of Council Consideration of the extension of the Mobil Oil Corporation pipeline franchise.

Proof of publication was provided by City Clerk Babb and it was ordered filed, there being no objection.

The following staff recommendations were noted.

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RECOMMENDATION OF CITY ATTORNEY/CITY MANAGER:

The City Manager and City Attorney recommend that Mobil Oil Company be granted a new pipeline franchise on the terms and conditions set forth in the proposed franchise ordinance.

CITY MANAGER NOTE:

While the City Manager concurs with the recommendation of the City Attorney, Council may wish to consider Mobil's recommendation as highlighted in Exhibit C which would allow for the "Long Beach-Carson Formula" similar to the Union and Four Corners Oil companies' franchise. It is important to note the efforts Mobil has made within the community. Mobil implemented a major beautification program which included extensive landscaping and bicycle paths. The corporation has also provided special art grants as well as donated numerous parcels of land.

It was pointed out by Mayor Armstrong that the subject agenda item is consideration of the renewal of an existing pipeline franchise, a matter which has no relationship to the refining problem, per se, or current issues now before the community regarding the refinery operations.

Representing Mobil Oil was Ms. Lucy Swindall, Manager of Mobil's Right-of-Way Department, 3700 West 190th Street, who voiced strong objection to the "Torrance Formula" fee structure proposed, requesting instead that the Carson-Long Beach Formula be levied, as was the case with Union Oil and Four Corners. This speaker pointed out that Mobil is negotiating the extension of an existing franchise with no new construction proposed, and further called attention to the extensive contributions Mobil has provided to the community by way of dedication of substantial parcels of land later used for streets and bikepaths and large monetary contributions, as well.

Speaking on behalf of the Western Oil and Gas Association, Mr. Greg McClintock also expressed opposition to the Torrance Formula noting concerns about legal and precedential aspects, and submitted a written statement (of official record) supporting this stand. This speaker further offered to work with the City in an effort to negotiate a formula acceptable to all.

Mr. Herman Herzbrun, 22611 Juniper Avenue, speaking as a resident, recommended that the franchise agreement contain a clause of the following nature:

That the duration of this franchise is subject to the condition that all Torrance facilities of the grantee

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be maintained and operated in compliance with the laws of the State of California and any orders of the South Coast Air Quality Management District or the successor thereto.

Councilwoman Geissert pointed out that the tools for maintaining air quality management lie with the AQMD and, in her opinion, the above wording would not be an appropriate addition to the pipeline franchise.

City Attorney Remelmeyer concurred with Mrs. Geissert's statement, stressing that, although the City may vote not to connect the pipeline franchise with air pollution violations, this should not be taken as a symbol of any lack of intensity of prosecution on the City's part -- the City is, in fact, vigorously prosecuting Mobil Oil's air pollution violations.

The City Manager's note as set forth in the staff recommendation on this item, was emphasized by City Manager Jackson, who specifically called out the assistance afforded the City by Mobil in the past in dedicating land necessary for several streets surrounding the refinery (Prairie/Madrona, Del Amo, and Crenshaw Boulevard).

There being no one else who wished to speak on this item, Councilman Applegate moved to close the hearing. His motion was seconded by Councilwoman Geissert, and roll call vote was unanimously favorable (Councilman Wirth absent).

During the ensuing Council discussion, Councilman Applegate expressed his opinion that the formula being proposed for the Mobil franchise be named something other than the "Torrance Formula" in that it has never been officially adopted or actually charged heretofore. Continuing, Mr. Applegate compared the rationale used in determining the fee structure for Union Oil and Four Corners and judged that the same circumstances "even more so" prevail in the case of Mobil Oil.

On that basis, Councilman Applegate stated that it would be his preference to grant the franchise utilizing the Carson/Long Beach Formula (rather than the Torrance Formula), thus making Mobil Oil uniform with those rates that were charged for Union Oil for the same thing.

Councilman Applegate SO MOVED. His motion was seconded by Councilwoman Geissert.

Prior to roll call vote, Councilman Walker expressed his opinion that violations of the air quality rules by Mobil are occurring far too often, and for the Council to reduce the proposed pipeline franchise fees from those recommended by the

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City Attorney and City Manager to those recommended by Mobil would send the "wrong signals to the community." Mr. Walker deemed this the right time to implement the change in fee structure.

Mayor Armstrong noted his opinion that no useful purpose would be served by clouding this franchise issue with the other broader problem of air quality violations which are being pursued by the AQMD with the City substantially involved. To introduce that element into these negotiations would, per Mayor Armstrong, tend to complicate the picture.

While voicing her concurrence with the need for an update of the current formula and her respect for the revised (Torrance) formula as submitted by the City Manager/City Attorney, Councilwoman Geissert stated her opinion that the revised formula "goes too far." Consistency in the levying of fees was deemed important by Mrs. Geissert, who compared land dedication by Mobil with land dedication by Union and noted that, while the Four Corners franchise did not involve land dedication, their franchise was shortened to a ten-year period.

Roll call vote on Councilman Applegate's motion to grant the requested franchise renewal based on the Carson-Long Beach Formula, was as follows:

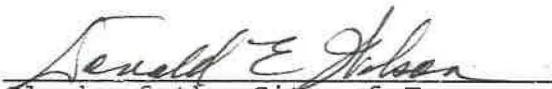
