MINUTES OF A SPECIAL MEETING
OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF TORRANCE

The City Council of the City of Torrance convened in a special meeting in the Council Chamber, City Hall, Torrance, California on Monday, October 5, 1936 at 5 P.M.

Mayor Stanger called the meeting to order.

Clerk Bartlett called the roll, those answering present being Councilmen: McGuire, Powell, Tolson and Stanger. Absent: Councilman Hitchcock.

The City Clerk read the purpose of the special meeting, which was to authorize the purchase of a fire truck and hose for the Hollywood-Riviera section, and to authorize the transfer of a neon sign from Western and El Prado to the city limits of South Torrance on Narbonne.

Councilman McGuire moved that an appropriation be made for the purchase of a fire truck and equipment for the Hollywood-Riviera district (the City's Ford V-8 truck chassis to be used), it being understood that the Hollywood-Riviera people will furnish a written agreement to house and man the truck, with the exception that the City will furnish one paid volunteer fireman. Councilman Tolson seconded the motion, which was carried by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: McGuire, Powell, Tolson and Stanger. NOES: COUNCILMEN: None. ABSENT: COUNCILMAN: Hitchcock.

Councilman Tolson moved that the Torrance neon sign located at Western and El Prado be transferred to the city limits of South Torrance on Narbonne and that an appropriation be made to cover the

cost of said transfer. Councilman McGuire seconded the motion, which was carried by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: McGuire, Powell, Tolson and Stanger. NOES: COUNCILMEN: None. ABSENT: COUNCILMAN: Hitchcock.

At 5:10 P.M., upon motion of Councilman McGuire, seconded by Councilman Tolson, the meeting adjourned.
