City of Torrance Recycling Requirement for Construction and Demolition Projects (Waste Management Plan - WMP)

Per the California Green Building Code, your project is subject to the following recycling requirements:

Recycle or reuse a minimum of 65% of the project waste, 100% of excavated soil and land-clearing debris and any universal waste* from the site.

Prior to your final inspection, you must submit receipts and documentation to verify how all the waste from your project was treated: whether it was landfilled, donated, recycled or reused. Documentation/receipts must show where the material was taken, what the material was, how much the material weighed and how it was treated. Send this information to Waste Management Coordinator, Alison Sherman, <u>ASherman@TorranceCA.Gov</u> or fax to (310) 781-6902. Make sure to **include this form** with the final submittal.

If you do not meet this requirement, you can be fined up to \$10,000 for noncompliance. The City has suggestions and information that can assist with meeting these requirements in printed and online form. Information on Universal Waste

Universal wastes are hazardous waste products that are widely used by households and many businesses, and may be included in construction or demolition projects.

Universal wastes include:

- <u>Electronic devices</u>: such as computers, televisions, cell phones and DVD players
- <u>Batteries</u>: most household batteries, such as rechargeable nickel-cadmium, silver button, mercury and alkaline batteries
- <u>Electric lamps</u>; fluorescent tubes and bulbs, electric lamps that contain added mercury or lead
- <u>Mercury-containing equipment</u>: thermostats, switches, thermometers, pressure or vacuum gauge dilator and weighted tubing and gas flow regulators
- <u>CRTs</u>: the glass picture tubes removed from devices such as televisions and computer monitors
- Non-empty aerosol cans

Universal Wastes may not be disposed of in the trash!

All universal waste must be taken to one of the following for safe recycling or disposal:

- Household Hazardous Waste Facility (small fee) permanent locations in San Pedro, El Segundo and Signal Hill. Businesses can use these facilities through the countywide Small Quantity Generator Program.
- Take-Back retail locations (free) Home Depot and Lowes take florescent bulbs and rechargeable batteries, Walsers Art Supply in Torrance will take many electronic devices.
- Collection Events Los Angeles County runs free, periodic events for the public on Saturdays in different locations.
