

- Install new signage on Line 4X stops first





- Showcase safety features on buses




















Upcoming Bus Purchase

- 2015 Net Toll Revenue Re-investment Grant
 - Award: \$1.2 million
- 2 new CNG buses



Downtown Trolley

- Staff is continuing research on this project
- Funding challenges:
 - Federal Grant Applications much demonstrate a "need" and not a "want"
 - Limited federal funding for trolleys
- Trolley studies are included in upcoming COA

Regional Transit Center Update

- Bids for construction was posted on the City website on Aug. 2, 2017
- Construction is anticipated to begin early 2018
- Staff continues to seek grant funding opportunities to supplement the project
