

Riviera Park is a "vest pocket park" which is .3 acres. This land is on the west side of the intersection of Catalina and Palos Verdes Boulevard which has two acres of publicly owned land, owned by the Cities of Torrance (60%) and Redondo Beach (40%).

The park was named for the area Hollywood Riviera in Torrance. This vacant lot was developed by the joint efforts of the two cities and hundreds of donations to include the Riviera Park Commission, Riviera Village Association, Riviera Rotary Club and the Hollywood Riviera Sportsman Club. Mr. Richard Gawne was the local landscape architect chosen to draw up plans for the park's development. A plaque was placed in the park which bears the donors' names that contributed donations of \$100 or more for its development.

This beautiful park was officially dedicated on December 6, 1969. Each city has agreed to maintain its respective area of the park once it was developed. This park is already surrounded by beautiful adjacent areas and has a picnic table, bench, and drinking fountain.
