H igh V isibility E nforcement

On Thursday, February 15, 2018, an HVE operation was conducted at Pacific Coast Hwy and Hawthorne Boulevard between 7:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. The majority of the violations centered around **"IMPROPER CELLPHONE USAGE"**, **"FAILURE TO OBEY SIGNS"** and **"UNSAFE SPEED."**

A second HVE operation was conducted the same day at the intersections of Crenshaw Boulevard and Artesia Boulevard, as well as Redondo Beach Boulevard and Prairie Avenue between 3:30 p.m. and 5:30 p.m. The majority of the violations centered around **"IMPROPER CELLPHONE USAGE"** and **"STOP LIGHT VIOLATIONS."**

Five pedestrians were cited for jaywalking, and an additional driver was cited for travelling on the wrong side of the road. An unlicensed 17-year-old, who was clocked at 90 mph on a motorcycle, was also cited.

The Torrance Police Department will continue to partner with our community to address traffic safety concerns throughout the city. Traffic Sign Boards reminding drivers to obey traffic laws will be used at intersections while motor officers devote the majority of their time to educating the community
