SUBJECT: Consider Implementation of Non-Aviation Hangar Rentals at Torrance Municipal Airport- Zamperini Field.

RECOMMENDATION

The Facilities Operations Manager recommends that:

- 1. The Airport Commission review and recommend the implementation of Non-Aviation Hangar Rentals at Torrance Municipal Airport Zamperini Field and;
- 2. The Airport Commission form a three member committee to work with Airport stakeholders to develop a new Non-Aviation Hangar Rental Agreement.

BACKGROUND

At its meeting of December 1, 2020 the City Council directed staff to provide the Airport Commission with information to explore and consider Non-Aviation Hangar Rentals at Torrance Municipal Airport – Zamperini Field. Throughout its history, Torrance Municipal Airport has not allowed tenants to exclusively house non-aviation related items.

Based on research from other airports, non-aviation hangars are defined as spaces used to store personal property such as vehicles, boats, motorcycles and household goods solely owned by the renter. Some airports incorporate non-aviation hangars to fill vacancies and help assist with non – compliant aeronautical tenants. In researching airports with these types of hangar spaces, they are restricted to the above mentioned items, and prohibit businesses or commercial activity. In addition, the hangar must meet all fire codes, regulations, and inspections. No storage of hazardous or toxic materials allowed.

In researching nearby airports, offering non-aviation hangars has been successful in filling vacancies, even at the higher rates. One local airport has a waiting list of 35 for non - aviation hangars. The list has been put on hold since their maximum amount of hangars allotted for non-aviation have been met. Historically, there has been very low turnover for these hangars.

In addition, instead of evicting tenants for defaulting on their rental agreement, this option provides a new method to enforce aviation hangars for aviation use or change them over to the non – aviation rate instead. This will help with reducing the amount of time spent on repetitive notices of non – compliance to hangar tenants and reduce the amount of time spent with legal matters. This also provides an alternative option for those selling their aircraft or leaving

aviation, but want to maintain the use of a hangar to store personal property and be part of the airport community/culture.

Compton, San Gabriel Valley (El Monte), and Santa Monica airports maintain a policy for aviation hangars by issuing a 7, 10, or 30 day eviction notice to non-aviation hangar tenants when aviation hangars are in higher demand. Aviation takes priority in this situation and reduces the number of non – aviation hangar tenants as demand for aviation hangars increases. This could be considered for Torrance.

ANALYSIS

Currently, the City owned hangar resident rate for aircraft storage is \$0.592 per square foot and non-resident rate is \$0.664. Aircraft must be registered with the FAA, be operational, and must have current aircraft insurance. In comparing other area airports, some offer non-aviation rates ranging from 80% to 200% more than their aircraft hangar rate.

Staff has explored converting approximately 10%, or 35 of the 341 City owned hangars into non-aviation. This will also allow members of the public without aircraft to rent hangars, while also converting any hangars out of current compliance to non-aviation use. Currently, there are eleven small hangar vacancies. These are the types of hangars which will be designated for non-aviation use. There are 50 people on the waiting list, but they are for the larger type (Medium and Executive) hangars. The larger hangars would not be eligible for non-aviation use. The airport administration receives on average 3 inquiry calls weekly for non-aviation hangar availability, and it is staff's belief that these hangars will achieve 100% occupancy.

Staff is proposing a resident rate of \$1.184 per square foot and a non-aviation non-resident rate of \$1.328 per square foot. This is a 100% increase over the current aeronautical hangar rate.

It is anticipated to generate an additional \$282,615 of revenue per year. This additional revenue will allow the City to fund future Airport capital projects such as the main runway slurry seal and painting, installation of an automated weather observing system (AWOS) and General Aviation Center and restroom remodels.

CONCLUSION

Staff recommends that the Airport Commission review and recommend the implementation of non-aviation hangar rates, and form a committee to establish a new Non-Aviation Hangar Rental Agreement. The committee's recommendation would then be brought forward to the entire Airport Commission for review.

Total Number of City-Owned Hangars	341

The 341 hangars owned by the City are broken down into three size categories: small, medium, and executive. Of 341 total hangars, 74 were built by the City, while 267 hangars were funded by several private contractors. At time of construction, these hangars were built with individual preferences in mind and were not standardized according to size. Here are approximate sizes of small, medium and executive hangars.

Small Type B: 40'-41' Door Opening Width 800-1,200 sq. ft.

Medium: 52'-54' Door Opening Width 1,200-2,200 sq. ft.

Executive: 57'-61' Door Opening Width 2,200-3,200 sq. ft.

Current rates for hangars are: \$0.592/sq. ft. per month for Torrance Residents. \$0.664/sq. ft. per month for Non-Residents.

Current rates for Tiedowns are: Single Engine \$118.00

Twin Engine \$130.00

Current rates for Transient (Overnight) are: Single Engine \$10.00

Twin Engine \$16.00

Jet Engine \$21.00

Definitions:

<u>INCIDENTS</u>: An occurrence associated with the operation of an aircraft which takes place between the time any person boards the aircraft with the intention of flight and all such persons have disembarked, and in which any person suffers death or serious injury, or in which the aircraft receives substantial damage.

SUBSTANTIAL DAMAGE means damage or failure which adversely affects the structural, strength, performance, or flight characteristics of the aircraft, and which would normally require major repair or replacement of the affected component. Engine failure or damage limited to an engine if only one engine fails or is damaged, bent fairings or cowling, dented skin, small punctured holes in the skin or fabric, ground damage to rotor or propeller blades, and damage to landing gear, wheels, tires, flaps, engine accessories, brakes, or wingtips are not considered "substantial damage".

SERIOUS INJURY means any injury which: (1) requires hospitalization for more than 48 hours, commencing within 7 days from the date the injury was received; (2) results in a fracture of any bone (except simple fractures of fingers, toes, or nose); (3) causes severe hemorrhages, nerve, muscle or tendon damage; (4) involves any internal organ; or (5) involves second or third degree burns; or any burns affecting more than 5% of the body surface.

<u>INCIDENT</u>: Any occurrence other than an accident associated with the operation of an aircraft, which affects or could affect the safety of operations.

NOTE: Per the FAA, Airport Operations totals will no longer be reported for the previous month. Due to automation, the totals will now be reported two months after they occur.
