RECOMMENDATION

The Public Works Director recommends that the Traffic Commission obtain public input regarding traffic conditions at the intersection of Linda Drive and Sunnyview Street.

BACKGROUND

In February and August 2021, the City received reports from residents about vehicles speeding through the intersection of Linda Drive and Sunnyview Street. Public Works Department Staff is requesting public input regarding traffic conditions at the intersection to identify problems and develop solutions.

ANALYSIS

Existing Conditions

The intersection of Linda Drive and Sunnyview Street is a T-intersection located on local streets serving single family residential properties in the Seaside neighborhood (See Vicinity Map, Attachment 1). Linda Drive is 33 feet wide with double yellow centerline striping. Sunnyview Street is 34 feet wide with no centerline striping. Parking is allowed and sidewalks exist on both sides of both streets. There is an existing crosswalk on the west leg of the intersection only. There are existing STOP signs in the northbound and southbound directions at every intersection on Linda Drive from Milne Drive to Robert Road, except at Sunnyiew Street (See Existing Conditions Map, Attachment 2).

Visibility

Linda Drive slopes upward to the south with the highest point approximately 120 feet south of the intersection. The vertical curvature of the roadway limits visibility in the northbound and southbound directions. Stopping sight distance would be considered by staff before any traffic measure is implemented.

Traffic Counts

Traffic counts were collected in October 2021 (Attachment 3). Northbound Linda Drive is the dominant movement in the morning and afternoon weekday peak periods with the morning peak being heavier.

Stop Sign Warrants

Traffic volumes at the intersection are not sufficient to meet state-established traffic warrants for an all-way STOP at the intersection; however, an all-way stop can still be considered if needed to enhance right-of-way assignment, facilitate turning movements or to be consistent with neighborhood traffic controls. Visibility is a primary concern and would be carefully considered before any decision is made. If installed, the stop signs would be equipped with advanced warning signs and pavement legends ("STOP AHEAD") such that northbound drives are aware of the stop sign at Sunnyview Drive.

Speed Humps

The City has received several requests for speed humps to mitigate speeds on Linda Drive. Currently, the City of Torrance does not allow or approve of the installation of speed bumps, speed humps or speed cushions on any street. Although there are several contributing factors, the primary reasons are: 1) speed bumps, humps and cushions can cause an increase in the response time for emergency vehicles; and, 2) speed bumps, humps and cushions can cause a diversion of traffic to other nearby roadways. Speed humps are therefore not an option for Linda Drive.

Accident History

There were no reported collisions at the intersection during the past 5-years (2015-2019).

Alternatives

Staff has considered several possible measures to improve traffic conditions in the area such as installation of stop signs, installation of advanced warning signs and/or placement of radar feedback speed signs. Tonight's discussion will help staff determine the best alternative.

A public notice (Attachment 4) was mailed to 39 parcels notifying residents of tonight's meeting. The public notification area is shown in Attachment 5.




