



- Two (2) at-grade crossings (170th St and 182nd St)

Below-Grade/At-Grade

- Seven (7) under-crossings between Inglewood Ave and 170th St
- 182nd under-crossing

Elevated

 between existing station and ROW near 190th St


- Three areas require grade separation along corridor
 - Marine Station to 162nd St
 - Redondo Beach Blvd & Artesia Blvd
 - 3. 190th St transition

- Project is studying elevated configuration between Redondo Beach Station and 190th St






South Bay Galleria Station Connections







South Bay Galleria Station Concept








