## NON-CREDIBLE SCHOOL THREAT INVESTIGATION

On June 10<sup>th</sup>, 2022, the Torrance Police Department was contacted about an image uploaded on social media relating to a school threat at North High School in our city. This case was immediately investigated by officers from Patrol and detectives from our Detectives Division and Special Investigation Division.

During the investigation, the student was identified and officers were working with staff from North High School throughout this investigation. On that same day, officers and detectives responded to the student's house and made contact with the student and their parents. All involved parties are fully cooperating with our department on this investigation. Based on this investigation which included interviews and a search of the home, officers determined there was no credible threat to any students or staff at North High School. We are continuing to work with North High School staff to provide a safe and secure environment.

The Torrance Police Department takes these cases very seriously, and has brought in all available resources to investigate this incident. Our department continues to encourage the community to be vigilant of any criminal activity. "See Something, Say Something". Please know that the men and women of the Torrance Police Department are committed to protecting the safety of our students in Torrance and are working with Torrance Unified School District staff on creating an environment where students and teachers can thrive.

This investigation is being conducted under the command of Torrance Police Department Special Operations Bureau.
