#### 6A. APPROVAL OF MINUTES: MAY 2, 2022

<u>MOTION</u>: Commissioner Obejas moved to approve the May 2, 2022 minutes as amended. Commissioner Habel seconded the motion; a roll call vote reflected 6-0 approval (absent Commissioner Thomas).

<u>MOTION</u>: Commissioner Suruki moved to excuse the absence of Commissioner Thomas. Commissioner Farao seconded the motion; a roll call vote reflected 6-0 approval (absent Commissioner Thomas).

#### 7. ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

#### 7A. CITY OF TORRANCE TRAFFIC SIGNAL COMMUNICATIONS

Deputy Public Works Director Finton stated that the City of Torrance maintains 124 traffic signals citywide. In exception to remote traffic signals, each traffic signal is connected to the Traffic

Management Center; communication between each intersection and the Traffic Management Center has been disrupted with the increase in data, affecting the Econolite Centracs System. Staff is looking to improve the communications system.

Associate Engineer Que presented a PowerPoint presentation regarding traffic signal communications:

- There are three types of connections that provide a link between intersections: copper cables, wireless antennas, and fiber optic cables.
- The current network has a flat configuration allowing networks to communicate via broadcasting. The network is prone to data-storms making communication unreliable.
- Operations Staff drive throughout the City checking for intersection setup issues due to lack of intersection communication.
- Ongoing project involves management switches at each intersection; each switch
  allows virtual local area networks. Intersections are grouped into five zones, each with
  a hub. Intersections at each zone communicate with their own hub. Hubs communicate
  with the Traffic Management Center making information transfer centralized.
- Another layer was created to group devices together; having multiple layers will eliminate data-storms and manage data transfers throughout the network.
- Reliability issues are due to old copper interconnect lines and outdated ethernet radios.
- A Measure M Grant application was submitted to design and install a fiber backbone for the City.

Commissioner Suruki inquired what problems are predicted during the transition. Deputy Public Works Director Finton replied that the current system cannot tell what time of day it is, this prompts crews to be sent out to input time of day. Times are set based on volume and offset.

Chair Kosidlak inquired if the fiber optics would be integrated with the South Bay Council Government's Project. Associate Engineer Que replied that there are no plans to integrate the fiber optics at this time.

Deputy Public Works Director Finton stated that Staff is trying to install conduit with three innerducts, providing scalability. The central computer system allows communication with the County of Los Angeles, sharing data with adjacent agencies and enhancing coordination across jurisdictional boundaries.

Additional members of the Commission spoke.

#### 8. ORAL COMMUNINICATION

Commissioner Habel stated that after 8 years on the Commission, this will be his last meeting; Commissioner Habel thanked Staff and the Commission.

Chair Kosidlak stated that after 4 years he will be moving on to other opportunities; Chair Kosidlak thanked Staff and the Commission.

Commissioner Suruki stated thanked Chair Kosidlak and Commissioner Habel for their leadership.

Commissioner Obejas thanked Chair Kosidlak and Commissioner Habel and commended their contributions.

Steve Finton thanked Chair Kosidlak and Commissioner Habel for their service.

#### RECOMMENDATION

The Public Works Director recommends that the Traffic Commission obtain public input regarding a proposal by Caltrans to install a traffic signal at the intersection of Hawthorne Boulevard and West 238th Street.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Hawthorne Boulevard is a state highway under Caltrans jurisdiction. It is a major commercial and transportation corridor in Torrance. Presently, there is no traffic signal on Hawthorne Boulevard at 238th Street which allows vehicles to continuously travel on Hawthorne Boulevard Street between Skypark Drive and Pacific Coast Highway and requires motorists on 238th Street to stop and yield to oncoming traffic (Attachment 2 -Existing Conditions Map).

In September 2019, the City of Torrance received a request from a resident for a traffic signal installation on Hawthorne Boulevard at 238th Street to facilitate left-turn movements from eastbound 238th Street to northbound Hawthorne Boulevard. The email was forwarded to Caltrans for investigation.

Caltrans will present their findings and subsequent proposal of a traffic signal installation at the intersection at this meeting. Staff is bringing this issue to Traffic Commission to provide residents an opportunity to comment on this proposal.

A public notice notifying residents of this meeting (Attachment 5) was mailed to 456 parcels in the area bordered by Ocean Avenue, 238th Street, Skypark Drive, Madison Street, and Pacific Coast Highway.




