Interchange Improvements and New Aux Lanes

TORRANCE— The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will start construction on Interstate 405/Van Ness UC (I-405) for interchange improvements and new Aux Lanes. Caltrans will start necessary falsework that will limit the vertical truck clearance at Van Ness UC between 190th Street and 182nd street in the city of Torrance.

What to expect: Beginning October 13, Caltrans will start to restripe Van Ness Ave. The new lane configuration will be in place until March 2023 and will provide more room for motorists during construction. On October 14 Caltrans will place k-rail and construct false work at the end of October. This falsework will limit the truck clearance at the Van Ness UC (below I-405) to 14'- 6". Truck warning signs and detours will be provided for the duration of the work. Bridge work will only take place during the day from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Residents and local businesses located near the freeway may experience noise, vibrations, and dust associated with construction activities. Motorists should expect delays and are strongly advised to avoid the area and use alternate routes. Additionally, motorists can check traffic conditions before they leave by visiting the Caltrans Quickmap (quickmap.dot.ca.gov).

Benefits: The combination of traffic demands from population, housing and employment growth, as well as the limited capacity of the existing facility has led to increased traffic congestion and delays throughout the I-405 corridor. The goal of this project is to improve operational; conditions, reduce delays by decreasing congestion, while improving safety and implementing a long-life pavement strategy.

Closures may start and end later. Motorists should expect delays and are encouraged to check traffic conditions before leaving to their destination by visiting the Caltrans Quickmap.
