

Happy Hours @ KGL

Happy Hours @ KGL, a programming series to encourage active engagement with the Library, kicked off on April 28th with a performance by the South High School Jazz Band and keyboardist Andrew Choi. The grant funded program aims to bring the best of what the library has to the casual library user and, even more importantly, non-users, by making the invisible, visible.

By scheduling arts, culture, music, fitness, demonstration, and other fun and engaging events on the Library plaza, we will encourage the public to see this as both a living and gathering space – an entrance to and extension of the Library.

Friends of the Torrance Libraries

The Friends of the Library had a fantastic turnout for their first three-day book sale since the pandemic, earning over \$7,000 at the end of April. Monies earned by the Friends go to support programming and services across the City's six library locations.
