I've lived on Ocean avenue by 230th for 50 years. There's a lot more traffic than there use to be and some cars go too fast. The existing stop sign by Arnold does help to slow the traffic a bit but I feel an additional stop sign, so close to the other, will just cause gridlock and increased pollution twice a day. The traffic will be even heavier when the proposed residential units are built on the Gable Bowling alley property. Perhaps a reduced speed zone or speed humps would have the desired effect without the downfalls of cars stopping, starting, and stopping so frequently. An additional stop sign will increase congestion and pollution. At the very least, Perform a traffic flow survey to see what's best.
