This request complies with Article 14 of the Torrance Oil Code that requires all nonconforming oil wells to be abandoned or obtain operating extensions every third year.

This site is in the middle of a residential neighborhood and has frontages on both 227th and 228th Streets. The site was inspected for compliance with Torrance Oil Codes in November 2023 and passed. Proof has been submitted that the well produced at least 365 barrels of oil in the twelve (12) month period immediately preceding this hearing.

There has been one complaint of overgrown vegetation and noise for this well in October of this year. Environmental staff received a complaint about the noise via telephone call. Staff did not find the site to be overgrown and advised Signal Hill Petroleum of the noise complaint. Signal Hill Petroleum technicians responded to the site to investigate. Signal Hill Petroleum advised

City staff that the well had been shut down, as they found that the burner was creating a rumbling noise and needed to be replaced. Signal Hill technicians replaced the burner, no further complaints were received by Staff. Environmental Staff received correspondence in regarding the extension.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends <u>APPROVAL</u> of the three (3) year operating extension and Resolution #23-068 with the following conditions:

- 1) At least 365 barrels of oil or 3,650,000 cubic feet of gas must be produced in the twelve (12) month period immediately preceding the month in which the operation extension is made.
- 2) The facility must be operated and maintained in compliance with the provisions of Torrance Municipal Oil Code, Chapter 7.
- 3) The conditions required in the Precise Plan must be continuously maintained.



BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:

This request is in compliance with Article 14 of the Torrance Oil Code which requires all nonconforming oil wells to be abandoned or obtain operating extensions every third year.

This site is located on the southeast corner of Madrona Avenue and Del Amo Boulevard. The site is approximately nine acres and the oil well production is owned by Power Run Oil. The remaining acreage is owned by Torrance Refinery. The area closest to Madrona Avenue is leased yearly for Christmas tree sales.

There are two pumping units and storage tanks on site. The site was inspected for compliance with Torrance Oil Codes and Precise Plan requirements in November 2023 and passed. Proof has been provided that each well has produced at least 365 barrels of oil in the twelve (12) month period preceding this hearing.

There was one noise complaint for this well in January of this year. Environmental Staff received the complaint about the noise and responded out to the site. Noise was heard and staff contacted Power Run Oil regarding the noise. Power Run technicians performed maintenance to reduce the noise while waiting for a crew to repair the machinery. After the repair was performed a noise reading was performed by staff and the noise was found to be in compliance. No further complaints were received, and the issue was resolved.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends <u>APPROVAL</u> of the three (3) year operation extension and Resolution #23-069 with the following conditions:

- 1) At least 365 barrels of oil or 3,650,000 cubic feet of gas must be produced in the twelve (12) month period immediately preceding the month in which the operation extension is made.

This site is located at the eastern edge of the West High School parking lot adjacent to single-family residences. It measures approximately 125 feet by 76 feet. The oil well has been at this location since the 1930's. Oil is pumped from the well into the storage tanks and removed from the site by truck. Oil from two other Power Run sites is also piped into tanks at this location. This site was inspected for compliance with Torrance Oil Codes and Precise Plan requirements November 2023 and passed. Proof has been submitted that the well produced at least 365 barrels of oil in the twelve (12) month period preceding this hearing.

There have been several odor complaints regarding this well starting in January of this year. Residents are able to communicate their concerns directly to a Power Run Oil representative by

email or phone. City staff is normally included in email complaints from residents and in the responses from Power Run. Staff are also included in the email notifications that Power Run distributes regarding oil shipping dates and work occurring on site. Environmental Staff received the complaints about the odors through an email chain between residents and Power Run. Environmental Staff and Code Enforcement staff responded to the well site and the neighborhood to inspect for compliance. Staff did not smell any odors in the neighborhood or at the site. Environmental Staff and Code Enforcement do not have equipment to detect odors and/or gases. Residents worked with Power Run Oil, who responded to monitor with each complaint. No further complaints have been received; issue resolved. Staff has received email correspondence regarding the extension.




