On November 28, 2023, City Council directed the Community Development Department to develop a Beautification Awards Program (Program) that could be implemented to preserve and enhance the beautiful appearance of the residential neighborhoods in Torrance.

Tonight, staff is bringing forward the draft materials for the City of Torrance Beautification Awards. The intent of the Program is to focus on the beautification of neighborhoods and to honor property owners/residents for outstanding maintenance of their homes/properties.

As envisioned by staff, the City will accept nominations as submitted via the attached Nomination Form. Staff will sort the nominations via City Council District and prepare materials for the Torrance Environmental Quality and Energy Conservation Commission (TEQECC) to conduct judging. Depending on the number of nominations submitted, staff may elect to select finalists in order to facilitate timely judging. Judging criteria include curb appeal, pride of ownership, landscape design, structure maintenance, and contribution to the beautification of Torrance. There is also a Bonus category to allow for points for any features that may stand out such as sustainability, impressive décor, or other wow factors.

Award recipients will be selected with an overall first place in each City Council District. Up to three additional Honorable Mention Recipients will also be selected. The honorees will be announced by the TEQEC at a regularly scheduled meeting. Recipients will receive a certificate of recognition, a commemorative yard sign and a gift card to a local home improvement store.

We encourage the Commission to discuss the draft materials. Based on comments received from the Commission, staff anticipates presenting the final guidelines for the Program at the Commission's meeting date of April 4, 2024. Once the Program is finalized and approved by the Commission, it will then be presented to City Council for adoption.
