MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE TORRANCE CITY COUNCIL

1. CALL TO ORDER

The Torrance City Council convened in a regular session at 5:32 p.m. on Tuesday, December 15, 1998, in the City Council Chambers at Torrance City Hall.

ROLL CALL

Present: Councilmembers Cribbs, Lee, Messerlian, O'Donnell*, Walker

and Mayor Hardison. *arrived at 5:33 p.m.

Absent: None.

Also Present: City Manager Jackson, City Attorney Fellows,

City Clerk Herbers, and other staff representatives.

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At this time Agenda Item No. 20 was considered out of order.

20. **EXECUTIVE SESSION**

At 5:32 p.m., pursuant to California Government Code Sections 54957.6, 54956.9(a), and 54956.9(c), the Council recessed into a closed session to confer on matters listed on the meeting agenda.

At 6:47 p.m., the Council reconvened in Council Chambers. No formal action was taken on any matter heard in closed session.

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2. FLAG SALUTE/ INVOCATION

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Beach Cities Civil Air Patrol Squad #107.

Captain Don Gilger, The Salvation Army, gave the invocation for the meeting.

3. AFFIDAVIT OF POSTING/WAIVE FURTHER READING

<u>MOTION:</u> Councilman Lee moved to accept and file the report of the City Clerk on the posting of the agenda for this meeting. The motion was seconded by Councilwoman Cribbs and, there being no objection, it was so ordered by Mayor Hardison.

<u>MOTION:</u> Councilman Lee moved that, after the City Clerk has read aloud the number and title to any resolution or ordinance on the meeting agenda, the further reading thereof shall be waived, reserving and guaranteeing to each Councilmember the

right to demand the reading of any such resolution or ordinance in regular order. The motion was seconded by Councilwoman Cribbs, and, there being no objection, it was so ordered by Mayor Hardison.

4. <u>WITHDRAWN/DEFERRED ITEMS</u>

City Manager Jackson announced that Item No. 6b (Torrance Area Chamber of Commerce 1st Quarter Budget Report) was withdrawn and rescheduled for the January 12, 1999, City Council meeting; and that Item No. 14b (Vacation of a Portion of Torrance Boulevard) would be rescheduled to January 19, 1999.

5. COUNCIL COMMITTEE MEETINGS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mayor Hardison announced that the annual "Toys for Tots" program would be continuing through December 20, 1998, and that anyone wishing to donate may bring a new, unwrapped toy or gift certificate to the Torrance Police Department, Torrance Fire Station, or Torrance Main Library.

City Clerk Herbers announced that Commission applications are being accepted in the City Clerk's office until 5:30 p.m. on January 6, 1999, with appointments to be made at the City Council meeting of January 12, 1999.

7b. YOUTH COUNCIL DONATIONS

Recommendation

The Torrance Youth Council recommends that City Council approve a \$6,500 donation from the Torrance Youth Council Donation Fund in the following amounts:

- (1) \$5,500 to Parks and Recreation Department for the Make*A*Circus program; and
- (2) \$1,000 to the Volunteer Center for Operation Backpack.

7c. TORRANCE ROSE FLOAT ASSOCIATION DONATION

Recommendation

The Parks and Recreation Director recommends that City Council accept a donation of \$15,000 from the Torrance Rose Float Association and appropriate this amount to Account #620062.

Recommendation

The Parks and Recreation Director recommends that City Council approve expenditures for senior citizens program excursions planned for the months of January through June, 1999.

Recommendation

The Engineering Director recommends that City Council approve Final Tract Map No. 52408, located at 2808 - 235th Street, which substantially conforms to and has met all conditions of approval of the tentative map.

7f. UPDATE ON PHASE II OF CITY'S CLASSIFICATION PLAN

Recommendation

The Human Resources Director recommends that City Council accept the update on Phase II of the City's Classification Plan.

7g. HOLLYWOOD RIVIERA SPORTSMAN'S CLUB DONATION

Recommendation

The City Librarian recommends that City Council accept and appropriate a \$509.00 donation from the Hollywood Riviera Sportsman's Club for the purchase of range end shelving for the Walteria Branch Library.

7h. CONTRACT FOR LIABILITY CLAIMS ADMINISTRATION

Recommendation

The Human Resources Director recommends that City Council approve a one-year contract with Ward North America, Inc., from January 1, 1999, to January 1, 2000, at an annual cost not to exceed \$94,000, for liability insurance.

7i. PURCHASE ORDERS RE STANDARD PERSONAL COMPUTER SOFTWARE

Recommendation

The Information Systems Director and the Police Chief recommend that City Council authorize a purchase order be issued for an anticipated amount not-to-exceed \$110,000 in total for a one-year period to ASAP Software Express, Inc.

7j. PURCHASE ORDER RE LEGAL ADVERTISING FOR FISCAL YEAR 1998-99

Recommendation

The City Clerk recommends that City Council authorize a purchase order for an anticipated amount not to exceed \$23,000 to the Daily Breeze for legal advertising.

7k. CONTRACT RE SUPERKIDS GYMNASTICS

Recommendation

The Parks and Recreation Director recommends that City Council approve an agreement hiring Superkids as the provider of gymnastics classes at the Torrance Cultural Arts Center, not to exceed \$85,320.00.

<u>MOTION:</u> Councilwoman O'Donnell moved for the approval of Consent Calendar Item Nos. 7a through 7k. The motion was seconded by Councilman Walker and passed by unanimous roll call vote.

8. <u>LIBRARY / PARKS & RECREATION</u>

8a. 1999 GRANT PROGRAM FOR NON-PROFIT SOCIAL SERVICES AGENCIES

Recommendation

The Community Services Commission recommends that City Council approve funding under the 1999 Grant Program for Non-Profit Social Services Agencies to be awarded to Behavioral Health Services, Inc. (\$1,800), Community Helpline, Inc. (\$2,500), Enrichment Through Employment (\$1,370), Home Ownership for Personal Empowerment (\$3,860), Jewish Family Service of Los Angeles (\$1,000), My Handi-Capable Reporter (\$5,000), Retired & Senior Volunteer Program (\$2,500), and South Bay Post-Polio Support Group (\$800), for a total of \$18,830. The Parks and Recreation Director concurs with the Commission's recommendations with the exception of funding the \$1,000 grant to the Jewish Family Service of Los Angeles, for a total allocation of \$17,830. The Community Services Commission and the Parks and Recreation Director recommend that City Council authorize unused funds from 1999 to be reallocated to the 2000 grant program.

Parks and Recreation Director Barnett reported that the Commission's and staff's recommendations for the 1999 grant program are consistent with the exception of the Jewish Family Service of Los Angeles, and that staff was not recommending funding for that agency because they elected not to send a representative to interviews before the Commission. He indicated that over 90 letters were sent out to former grant program participants, but only 10 applications were received; and requested that unused funds be rolled over into the 2000 grant program.

Mr. Paul Nowatka, Chairman of the Community Services Commission, offered clarification concerning the Commission's recommendation for funding the Jewish Family Service in the amount of \$1,000; noted that a survey will be done to determine the reason for the decrease in the number of applicants; and requested that unused funds be reserved for next year's grant program.

MOTION: Councilman Lee moved to concur with the Commission's recommendations in the amount of \$18,830 and authorized unused funds from 1999 to

be reallocated to the 2000 grant program. The motion was seconded by Councilman Walker and passed by unanimous roll call vote.

9. TRANSPORTATION/ PUBLIC WORKS

9a. ANNUAL APPROPRIATION FOR STREET LIGHTING COSTS

Recommendation

The Planning Director recommends that City Council appropriate \$1,717,000 from previously unexpended street lighting funds that have been transferred into the General Fund to cover operational costs of providing street lighting and signals throughout the City of Torrance during fiscal year 1998-99. The Planning Department further recommends that City Council approve the corrected appropriation of \$100,000 from the same source for the preparation of a new Street Lighting District.

Councilman Lee questioned whether the provision of maintenance and energy could be bifurcated to take advantage of the impending competitive marketplace, and City Manager Jackson agreed to explore the possibility.

In response to Mayor Hardison's inquiry, Traffic Engineering and Transportation Planning Manager Buchman outlined the tentative timeline for a public meeting, a public hearing, and balloting regarding the formation of a new street lighting district in the spring.

<u>MOTION:</u> Councilman Lee moved to concur with the staff recommendations. The motion was seconded by Councilman Walker and passed by unanimous roll call vote.

10. **POLICE / FIRE**

10a. **DISPOSITION OF FIRE EQUIPMENT**

Recommendation

The Fire Chief recommends that City Council adopt a resolution authorizing title transfer of five lengths of surveyed 1 3/4" hose, three surveyed 1 1/2" nozzles, and two Scott Air Paks to the L. A. County Fire Chief's Physical Ability Testing (PAT) program.

City Manager Note

The subject equipment has no value to the City of Torrance.

Fire Chief Bongard presented the staff report (per written material of record).

Recommendation

The Planning Director recommends that City Council adopt a resolution denying the appeal and denying DIV98-0013 to allow one lot to be subdivided into four lots on property located in the R-1: Single-Family Residential Zone at 1902 West 237th Street. (DIV 98-0013) LANCO ENGINEERING

Acting Planning Manager Parkin Tate advised that this resolution documents the Council's prior action of November 10, 1998.

MOTION: Councilman Messerlian moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 98-158. The motion was seconded by Councilwoman Cribbs and passed by unanimous roll call vote.

11b. **RESOLUTION NO. 98-159 RE 2051 233RD STREET**

Recommendation

The Planning Director recommends that City Council adopt a resolution denying the appeal and denying DIV98-0012 to allow one lot to be subdivided into three lots, two of which are flag lots, on property located in the A-1: Light Agricultural zone at 2051 233rd Street. Acting Planning Manager Parkin Tate advised that this resolution also corresponds to the Council's action of November 10, 1998.

Recommendation

The Planning Director recommends that City Council adopt a resolution to repeal Resolution No. 98-147, and adopt an ordinance to enact a Zone Change, ZON98-0002, reclassifying from R-1 (Single-Family Residential District) to PD (Planned Development District) a 7.2 acre property located at 23030 Maple Avenue. ZON98-0002: THE OLSON COMPANY

Acting Planning Manager Parkin Tate explained that this action is necessary to correct a procedural error on November 24, 1998.
